 which each of my grand children herein named may be entitled shall  
 be loaned out at the rate of interest which loaned money usually commands  
 and that the principal so lent be so invested as to be made entirely  
 secure at the end of each year and that as soon as my said grand sons  
 severally arrive at the age of sixteen years the sums of money to which  
 they may be entitled shall be paid to them or their lawfully appointed  
 guardian if thought advisable by their family or guardian, having  
 many years endured the afflictions and sorrows of death I cheerfully  
 surrender my body to the grave and my spirit to God who gave it  
 hoping for a blessed immortality beyond the grave. Witness my hand  
 and seal, done on this the 19<sup>th</sup> day of September 1854
