Know all to whom these presents shall come greeting Know ye that David Houser late of the County of Marshall hath departed this life having made his last will and testament, wherein amongst others John McPherson is appointed Executor. The said will being duly proven and admitted to record in the Probate Court of the County of Marshall aforesaid and the said John McPherson having entered into bonds as the Court under such execution approved by our said Court. There are therefore to authorize and empower you the said John McPherson to take possession of all and singular the goods, Chattels, lands and tenements, rights and credits of the said David Houser deceased, authorizing and requiring you, the said John McPherson to demand and recover the same by all legal means, and to pay and deliver to all judges entitled, all the legacies contained and specified in said will, as far as the said goods, Chattels, lands and tenements, rights and credits will extend, according to the value thereof, and as the law shall charge, and to do and perform any and all acts and things legally pertaining to the duties of Executor.
